Expressionism

 a 20th century movement in literature characterized by distortion of reality and the use of symbols to give objective expression to inner experience

Simile

• Direct comparison between two unlike things using the terms *like* or *as*

Metaphor

 Indirect comparison between two unlike things that does not use the terms *like* or *as*

Onomatopoeia

Word that imitates the natural sound that an object makes

Alliteration

• A series of words in a row or close to each other that start with the same consonant letter or same sound

Personification

 Type of metaphor that gives lifelike characteristics to an inanimate object or human traits to something nonhuman

Allusion

Reference to something that conjures up ideas of something else

Exact verbs

• Descriptive, vivid verbs that show specific actions

• Avoid "be" verbs as much as possible

Precise adjectives

• Fresh, specific adjectives that create imagery

- Avoid overused terms
 - oBeautiful

oLarge oNice

Specific nouns

• Very precise, descriptive nouns

Hyperbole

Extreme exaggeration
