Bibliography Cards

- You must give proper credit to all sources to avoid any hint of plagiarism.
- Write down all necessary documentation information before you start to take notes.
- Use one 3 x 5 index card for bibliography cards, and use one 3 x 5 note card for each source.
- Consult the “Documenting Your Research” page to be sure you list all the necessary information and punctuate it correctly.
- Write neatly!

Note Card Format

Topic of Info

of Bib Card – Page

Should match up to outline

- Use bullet points for information
- Do not use complete sentences unless quoting
- Leave a little white space all around info
- Write on only one side of note card
- Include only info related to the topic heading
- Include only info from the source listed above

Effects of Industrial Revolution

2 – p.2

- People moving to cities more
- Factory owners becoming rich off all production
- Working conditions = poor – crowded, unhealthy, dangerous
 - Safety standards introduced by law
 - Labor unions pop up
