1. peek

throw a glance at; take a brief look at

He put his hands under his head and watched them eat breakfast, smiling as the girls kept **peeking** at him over their cereal bowls.

2. lurch

move abruptly

He said something to the driver, and the cab lurched into the uptown traffic.

3. fleck

a small fragment of something broken off from the whole

A breeze had sprung up, whipping **flecks** of white on the Hudson River.

4. mumble

talk indistinctly; usually in a low voice

"I don't know," mumbled Henry, lowering himself into a soft chair.

5. sluggish

moving slowly

If you eat a big meal too close to a fight there isn't time for proper digestion. Makes you **sluggish** and slow, and one good punch to the belly and—

6. integrated

not segregated

"This is a fairly well-integrated neighborhood," said Spoon.

7. murmur

a low continuous indistinct sound

The room was dark, and the murmur of voices outside the door was too low to make out words.

satchel

luggage consisting of a small case with a flat bottom

They climbed into the front, Bud carrying his black **satchel**, an overnight bag, and a large cardboard box.

9. pierce

sound sharply or shrilly

The crowd started whistling, piercing whistles that upset his concentration.

10. plod

walk heavily and firmly, as when weary, or through mud

Rivera was **plodding** after him now on slow and heavy feet, pop-pop, stay one step ahead of him, jab and jump away, jab and hook and duck under the swinging arm.

11. rage

be violent; as of fires and storms

His legs were soft rubber and a fire was raging in the lower part of his belly.

12.fume

a cloud of fine particles suspended in a gas

Bud held a small bottle under his nose, and the **fumes** clawed up into his brain, and cleared his head.

13.tenant

someone who pays rent to use property owned by someone else

"For one thing, a lot of groups are trying to organize self-help programs in the black communities.

Parents' groups, tenants' groups...."

14. whimper

cry weakly or softly

They whimpered in the cold, and began to wake up.

15. instinct

inborn pattern of behavior often responsive to stimuli

You don't have the killer **instinct**, Alfred, the coldness to beat a man into the ground when you sense his weakness.

16. conquer

put down by force or authority

You **conquered** your fear. You worked hard. You almost quit once, and then you came back and worked harder.

17. hypnotized

having your attention fixated as though by a spell

"Are you guys hypnotized?"

18. bustle

move or cause to move energetically or busily

Betty bustled in a few minutes later, and started chattering with Spoon about her day at school.

19. narcotic

a drug that produces numbness or stupor

I talked to that doctor at the narcotics clinic, Alfred.

20.abreast

alongside each other, facing in the same direction

They went down the aisle three **abreast**, Donatelli and Henry moving him along with their shoulders, Bud right behind with the towels and the bucket, up the ring steps and through the ropes.

21. hover

hang in the air; fly or be suspended above

A gray shirt and a black bow tie hovered above him, and a forefinger waved in his face.

22. pummel

strike, usually with the fist

Hubbard was **pummeling** his ribs now, and Alfred worked his left arm free and began banging at the side of the bullet head, again and again, until Hubbard straightened up.

23. unanimous

in complete agreement

The bell rang, but neither of them heard it, grunting, straining, slugging, and then everyone was in the ring pulling them apart, grabbing their gloves.

". . . by unanimous decision . . . Elston Hubbard."

24. bellow

shout loudly and without restraint

"Let him breathe," bellowed Bud, pushing them all out and slamming the door shut.

25. thicket

a dense growth of bushes

The snow deadened his careful footsteps, over the smaller rocks, over the low **thicket** of leafless bushes.

26.**Seep**

pass gradually or leak or as if through small openings

He moved in closer, his knees quivering as the snow **seeped** through his trousers.
